Early Treatment versus Late Treatment

Synopsis of Lecture

The pediatric dentist should understand the controversy dealing with early vs. late orthodontic treatment. The clinician must also quantify the outcome benefit of beginning versus final profiles – frequency of distalization mechanics needed to correct Class II problems; and beginning versus final skeletal position. Distal movement of molars can create Class I dental relations with retrognathic maxillary and mandibular positions. This lecture provides a comparison between a conventional late treatment approach and no-conventional early treatment strategy.

Leonard J. Carapezza, D.M.D.

Dr. Leonard Carapezza has over 25 years of clinical experience in pediatric orthodontics, including a successful private practice in Wayland, Massachusetts.

Shortly after establishing his practice, he identified the extreme importance of early treatment of malocclusions. Dr. Carapezza’s clinical achievements have brought him recognition as a lecturer in the early treatment of a malocclusion.

Dr. Carapezza graduated from Brandeis University; the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey; then served two years in the United States Naval Dental Corps as a lieutenant aboard the U.S.S. Wasp.

Dr. Carapezza received his certificate from Children’s Hospital in Pediatric Dentistry, during which he served as a Teaching Fellow at the Harvard School of Dental Medicine.

Presently, Dr. Carapezza is an Associate Clinical Professor at Tufts University School of Dental Medicine, teaching early treatment of malocclusion to pedodontic graduate students. He is also an associate of the New England Medical Center and serves as a Clinical Associate Professor at the University Of Tennessee Department of Pediatric Dentistry.

Dr. Carapezza is a contributing editor to the Journal of Clinical Pediatric Dentistry, and has published numerous articles on pediatric malocclusion in addition to being a Senior Certified Instructor for both the American Orthodontic Society and International Association of Orthodontics.

He lectures internationally on “Early Treatment of Malocclusion” for general and pediatric dentists, and is the founder and director of the Institute for Growth and Development in Pediatric Dentistry.

FROM THE NEW JERSEY TURNPIKE- Exit 11 and follow signs to Garden State Parkway North Exit 131A. This puts you on Wood Ave. South. At the 3rd traffic light make a right turn onto Middlesex-Essex Turnpike. At the 3rd traffic light make another right turn. This puts you on Gill Lane, just before you reach the intersection of Route 1.

FROM THE GARDEN STATE PARKWAY- Traveling South- Take Exit 130 to Route 1 North. Continue until you see the Woodbridge Hotel on the left. Go straight through the traffic light and take the Gill lane jug handle in the right lane. Take a left at the intersection of Gill Lane and Route 1 and turn right into the Woodbridge Hotel's Main entrance. **Traveling North-** Take Exit 131A. This puts you on Wood Ave. South. At the 3rd traffic light make a right turn onto Middlesex-Essex Turnpike. At the 3rd traffic light make another right turn. This puts you on Gill Lane for approximately 2 miles to the Woodbridge Hotel which is on the right side of Gill Lane, just before you reach the intersection of Route 1.

FROM 287 NORTH OR SOUTH- Take the exit for Route 1 North. Continue until you see the Woodbridge Hotel on the Left. Go straight through the traffic light and take the Gill Lane jug handle in the right lane. Take a left at the intersection of Gill Lane and Route 1 and turn right into the Woodbridge Hotel's main entrance.

FROM NEWARK INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT- Take Route 1 and 9 South toward Woodbridge. Follow Route 1 South to the Woodbridge Hotel on the right hand side- approximately 12 miles.

FROM NEW YORK CITY- Take either the Holland or Lincoln Tunnel to the New Jersey Turnpike South, To Exit 11. Take the Garden State Parkway North, to Exit 131A. This puts you on Wood Ave. South. At the 3rd traffic light make a right turn onto Middlesex-Essex Turnpike. At the 3rd traffic light make another right turn. This puts you on Gill Lane, for approximately 2 miles to the Woodbridge Hotel which is on the right side of Gill Lane, just before you reach the intersection of Route 1.

FROM STATEN ISLAND- Take the Outer Bridge Crossing to Route 440. This will eventually turn into Route 287, which you will take going North. Take exit for Route 1 North. Continue until you see the Woodbridge Hotel on the left. Go straight through the traffic light and take the Gill Lane jug handle in the right lane. Take a left at the intersection of Gill Lane and Route 1 and turn right into the Woodbridge Hotel's main entrance.
