**Morning session**

**“Vital and non-vital pulp therapy for primary teeth”**

**Speakers- Dr.Yasmi Crystal and Dr.Vineet Dhar**

Pulp therapy for vital and non-vital primary teeth includes techniques that have been used for decades, allowing clinicians to extend the life of a primary tooth. Success is determined by accurate diagnosis of pulp vitality, and it may vary with the materials used as pulp therapy agents as well as the final restoration. Materials used in the last century have presented advantages and disadvantages; but in the last two decades, the introduction of new biocompatible materials has changed the stage, leading to better outcomes. In this presentation we discuss vital and non-vital pulp therapy recommended techniques and materials, in light of their reported cumulative success in systematic reviews and meta-analyses.

**Dr.Yasmi Crystal** Dr. Yasmi Crystal has a DDS degree from Universidad Tecnologica de Mexico (UNITEC), a DMD from the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey (UMDNJ), Pediatric Dental specialty training from Eastman Dental Center, University of Rochester and a MSc in Clinical and Translational Research from CTSI, NYU School of Medicine. She is part of the medical staff of RWJ, Rutgers University Hospital. Founder and senior specialist at Comprehensive Pediatric Dentistry in New Jersey and Clinical Professor of Pediatric Dentistry at NYU College of Dentistry, she is a Diplomate and an Examiner for the written and oral sections of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry, member of the Editorial Board of Pediatric Dentistry Journal and a spokesperson and past trustee of the AAPD, presently a member of the Council on Scientific Affairs and consultant on special projects of Evidence Based Dentistry. She is past President for the Pediatric Oral Health Research Group of the International Association of Dental Research and Fellow of the American Society for Dental Esthetics, the American College of Dentists and the International College of Dentists. Past member of the Board of Directors of the IAPD and past Chair of their Scientific Committee. She has been continuously active with the ADA, serving as member and chair of Prevention of CAPIR (council of access, prevention, and inter-professional relations), as speaker, steering committee member of inter-professional projects like “Choosing Wisely” with the Institute of Medicine and other prevention programs, and she is currently an expert consultant for the Scientific Council. She is also a member of the Editorial Board of the Journal of the Latin American Society of Pediatric Dentistry (Revista ALOP) and a manuscript reviewer for several major journals including Pediatric Dentistry, JADA, IJPD, BJD, JOCPD and many others. As leader in inter-professional relations, she has worked as Oral Health consultant, speaker and preceptor for the AAP, NJAAP, and is a faculty member for the Family Practice MD program at Somerset

Medical Center, NJ, with her clinic being a rotation site for family practice MD residents. Dr. Crystal lectures to varied health care audiences in the US and abroad, and has published her research on numerous articles in peer reviewed scientific journals on topics of Caries Management, including Pulp Therapy, Risk Assessment and Minimal Intervention Approaches including SDF therapy.

**Vineet Dhar, BDS., MDS, PhD** Professor and Chair, Department of Orthodontics and Pediatric Dentistry, University Of Maryland School of Dentistry, Baltimore, Maryland. Professor Dhar is a board-certified pediatric dentist serving as professor and department chair of Orthodontics and Pediatric Dentistry and graduate program director of Pediatric Dentistry at University of Maryland School of Dentistry, Baltimore. He serves on the Councils on Scientific Affairs and Post-doctoral Education at the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD) and on the Council of Scientific Affairs, American Dental Association (ADA). He currently serves on the ADA guideline panels on restorative care, caries prevention, and has in the past served on the pit and fissure sealants panel. He is also on the AAPD guideline panels on vital pulp therapies in primary and immature permanent teeth, and behavior guidance and has in the past served on the AAPD panel to produce clinical practice guidelines on non-vital pulp and vital pulp therapies in primary teeth. Dr. Dhar is the recipient of 2018 ADA Evidence Based Dentistry Mid-Career Faculty Award, and 2017 AAPD's Jerome B. Miller/Crest-Oral-B/For the Kids Award. He is also the co-recipient of the 2016 Paul P. Taylor award for his systematic review evaluating effectiveness of current therapies for ECC.

### **Afternoon session**

### **“Vital pulp therapy of permanent teeth and update on the trauma guidelines”**

#### **Speaker- Dr.Asgeir Sigurdsson**

In recent years our understanding on healing potential of a vital pulp in permanent teeth has significantly increased. Subsequently several studies have been published with encouraging results after vital pulp therapy in teeth with near or frank exposures of the pulp. In this lecture the concept of vital pulp therapy, will be presented and the literature for indications and contra indications reviewed. Most common techniques and materials for both direct and indirect capping will be presented and discussed and the recent American Association of Endodontist's Position Statement of Vital Pulp Therapy presented. In the second part of the presentation the current Dental Trauma Guidelines of the International Association of Dental Traumatology as well as soon to be published AAE's guidelines will be presented and reviewed. The presentation will be supported with actual cases and relevant discussion.

Course objectives:

At conclusion, the participants should know about current trends in vital pulp therapy, indications and contraindications of direct and indirect vital pulp capping. At conclusion, the participants should know about the most common dental injuries and recommended emergency treatment of those.

At the conclusion the participants should have an understanding why follow-up after dental trauma is important and what to look for at those appointments.

**Asgeir Sigurdsson, D.D.S., M.S.** Born and raised in Reykjavik, Iceland. Received his DDS from University of Iceland. Graduated from University of North Carolina (UNC), with certificate in endodontics and Master of Science with emphasis on neurobiology and pain. Full time faculty at UNC from 1992 until 2004, served as the Graduate Program Director of Endodontics 1997 to 2004. From 2004 to 2012 he was in a private endodontic practice in Reykjavik, Iceland and London, UK. In 2012 he became the Chairman of the Department of Endodontics, NYU College of Dentistry and is a tenured Professor there. Additionally, he is an adjunct Professor at UNC-Chapel Hill. In February 2019 he was appointed as the interim Chairman of Department of Periodontology and Implants and served in that capacity through August 2021. Dr. Sigurdsson is a past President of the International Association for Dental Traumatology and in 2014 he was appointed by AAE as a Director of the American Board of Endodontics, he served as the President of the Board 2019-2020. He serves on the editorial board of Dental Traumatologia, and has served as associate editor of ACTA Odontologica Scandinavica as well as having served on the editorial boards of International Endodontic Journal and OOOOE. He is currently the chair of the AAE's committee on revision of the AAE's Dental Trauma Guidelines. Dr. Sigurdsson has been invited well over 200 times to lecture in 47 countries all over the World, on the topics of pain, endodontics, dental trauma and/or forensic sciences. He has written or co-written 87 per-reviewed articles and 24 textbook chapters on same topics.
